## NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH FOR IRONSTONE

A new Neighbourhood Watch scheme for Phase 1A of Ironstone is now up and running. The successful scheme was set up 3 months ago and is co-ordinated by Jaimie Ramsay a resident of Pepper Mill.

The scheme which covers the whole of Phase 1A now has over 35% of the occupied properties as members. Jaimie is currently in the process of arranging a residents get together to give people a relaxed opportunity to meet neighbours and to discuss any concerns that they may have, Jaimie hopes that this will be attended by a member of the local policing team.

Following on from the success of Phase 1A, a group of residents from Phase 1B have come together and are in the process of starting up their own neighbourhood watch scheme in that area too. A co-ordinator for the Phase 1B scheme has been appointed, and once the details of the scheme are finalised, a leaflet will be put through all the doors in the area covered inviting you all to join the group.

Although crime levels for the area are low, the two groups have agreed that they will work closely together, sharing important information about any incidents that occur, so that all residents of both schemes can be vigilant towards these.

Of course, the only way to make these groups succeed is with the involvement of the residents, either taking an active or passive role in Neighbourhood Watch. Both group co-ordinators have previously been police CRB checked, so you can be assured that any details that you pass on to them will be handled in confidence and won't fall into the wrong hands.
